

Director's Note

Of all Oscar Wilde's plays, this is one of his most important. It presents Wilde at his most joyous, idealistic and optimistic in the setting of a dark family situation. The deep and moving meaning of the lives of the central characters are set against glittering London Society at the turn of the 19th Century and Wilde's language of this society is at its most witty including the scandalous description of the fox hunters, "The unspeakable in pursuit of the uneatable" and aphorisms like, "Nothing succeeds like excess."

The power of love really does triumph over all obstacles - the love of Mrs. Arbuthnot for Gerald, the love of Hester for Gerald and Gerald's salvation through the love of these two women.
