About the Production

Hay Fever is Noel Coward's first masterpiece, as true in its gossamer way as any of the great plays of the 20th century. Indeed one of the first things Laurence Olivier did when he was appointed to create the National Theatre was to invite Noel Coward to direct it, assuring the play of its rightful place in the English theatre repertoire and giving Noel a cast of brilliant young stars including Maggie Smith, Lynn Redgrave, and Derek Jacobi, and in her last major role, Dame Edith Evans.

It is extraordinary that so much of what we think of as quintessentially English, the speed and precision, the outrageousness, the eccentricity of *Hay Fever* was largely based not on an English family but on American actress Laurette Taylor and her family. Their houseparties were notorious for the family's behaviour, for the obscure and outlandish games to which guests were subjected, and for the heady atmosphere of flirtation, all of which the young budding playwright Noel Coward experienced first hand. He captured it all in one hectic week-end of writing and always maintained that *Hay Fever* was his favourite play.

You can imagine that when the Genesian Theatre Board asked me to direct *Hay Fever* I jumped at the chance to bring this delightful play to you.



The Company is a non-professional group operating from an historic church in Kent Street. While still retaining links with our origins, the Catholic Church, we do not shy away from meeting the challenges of plays that comment on the human condition.

The building which houses the Company was originally St John's Church, and dates from 1868. It has served as a church, a poor school, and was the first Matthew Talbot Hostel. Since 1954 it has been the home of The Genesian Theatre Company.

Over the years The Genesian Theatre Company has become a community theatre group providing a training ground for young actors and a place where those who love the theatre can meet, share, and extend their knowledge of the performing arts. The Genesian Theatre is one of Sydney's most active theatre companies. In addition to six main stage productions each year we run classes, workshops and many other activities.
