About the Production


Janet Preston is a successful writer of romantic novels. But disillusioned by an unsatisfactory marriage with a scoundrel from whom she has been separated for six years, Janet is fantasizing a new story with herself as the romantic heroine. Real life, however, intervenes with dramatic effect.

Set in 1950 in Janet's country cottage in Yorkshire, there are many twists and turns in this play which are reminiscent of Agatha Christie's classic plots. The playwright Leslie Sands, who was a successful British actor, was encouraged by J. B. Priestley to put pen to paper and wrote a number of plays of some renown. *Intent to Murder* is one of his best.

I have tried to faithfully recreate the look and attitudes of the early fifties, which are somewhat different to today's. My intent is to bring you a thriller that is entertaining and shocking and also encapsulates the values and mores of that time.

There are six very diverse characters in this play and our talented cast has enjoyed delving into their interesting lives. We hope that you enjoy *Intent to Murder*.
