Directors Notes

First I would like to thank all my wonderful cast and crew and especially Owen Gimblett for the set design and Laura Genders my wonderful assistant director. It's only possible with your efforts. And so to the play....

Agatha Christie conjures up such evocative images of theatre. Miss Marple, Poirot and other beautifully carved characters. In this, one of her most famous plays, she has created another fine piece of character driven mystery. Written back in the fifties and made into a memorable film with Charles Laughton and Marlene Dietrich with one of the finest film directors ever, Billy Wilder at the helm, the desire to direct this play was irresistible. In its day it would have been quite a rare (one would hope) spectacle to see the Old Bailey and the process of law. However over the years thanks to the swathe of legal programs stretching back to Rumpole and more recently shows like *Boston Legal*, the drama and spectacle of a court has been diminished. However the power of good writing, a twisting plot together with the central tenets of human nature, greed and envy, remain. It is a testament to the great author Agatha Christie, that this play has stood the test of time and remains as entertaining today as it was back in 1955.

The central question in any Agatha Christie mystery is a 'Whodunit' and this is no different despite the absence of the traditional cast of suspects and motives gathered in a drawing room. This play is far simpler with the question of whether Leonard Vole is 'Guilty or Not Guilty'. It's that simple. As the jury must decide, so must you but this time the prosecution has one surprise for you. A woman who testifies against her husband. Unheard of perhaps but then this is *Witness for the Prosecution* after all!

And as the credits rolled in the film, the voice over announces:

"The management of this theatre suggests that for the greater entertainment of your friends who have not yet seen the picture, you will not divulge, to anyone, the secret of the ending of *Witness for the Prosecution.*"

And I hope you all take heed and do the same.

The Genesian Theatre Company is a non-professional group operating from an historic church in Kent Street in the heart of the Sydney CBD. We boast among our alumni numerous household names in Australian theatre and film such as Bryan Brown, Baz Luhrmann, Judi Farr, and John Bell. We are, however, just as proud of the hundreds of talented amateur actors, directors, designers, lighting and sound specialists who have contributed to Sydney's unique little theatre over the years.

Over the years the company has developed into a group providing a training ground for young actors and a place where those who love the theatre can meet, share and extend their knowledge of the performing arts. The Genesian Theatre is one of Sydney's most active theatre companies. In addition to six or seven main stage productions each year we run classes, workshops and many other activities.

Membership of the company is open to all people over the age of eighteen.

The building that houses The Genesian Theatre Company was originally St John the Evangelist Church and dates from 1868. It has served as both a church and a poor school until 1932 when it became the Kursaal Theatre, housing the Sydney Repertory Company. In 1938 it became the first Matthew Talbot Hostel. Since 1954 it has been the home of The Genesian Theatre Company, which was formed in 1944.
